

Horses have always played an important role in the circus. During the 1920's and 1930's Ringling Bros. Barnum & Bailey Circus carried approximately 350 head of baggage stock and around 150 head of ringstock.


After the show switched to tractors and increased their use of motive power in 1939, the number of horses carried was greatly reduced. Throughout the 1940's and 1950's the show carried approximately 80 to 100 head of ringstock.


For the 1956 season, the last year under canvas, this total was increased to 121. The increase in number was due to the addition of 36 burros used in the spec. A breakdown of the horses was as follows: 26 liberty horses, 11 rosinback, 6 high school, 12 saddle horses, 12 draft, and 18 others.


In the 1950's the Ringstock Department was under the supervision of Frank T. Selock. All horses were transported in three to four specially built stock cars which usually traveled in the third section of the circus train. On the lot, they were housed in two tents located in the backyard. These tents were usually a square gable end type which were approximately 30' wide by 100' long.

For the 1956 season only one tent was used. This tent was a 55' round end with three 38' middles and one row of quarter poles. There were four rows of stalls; one along each side and two rows down the middle. The original plans were to have a "Horse Fair" open to the public. This was a repeat of an earlier idea used in 1939.


Around 1950, several changes occurred in the wagons carried by the Ringstock Dept. but, throughout the 1950's it had pretty well narrowed down to the following five wagons: No. 11 canvas, No. 30 baggage, No. 117 blacksmith, No. 136 supply, and veterinarian, No. 137 trappings. With the exception of No. 136, all of the wagons were originally from the Al. G. Barnes Circus. Under the direction of Bill Yeskee, Ringling's wagon builder, the original wooded undergear and spoke wheels were replaced with Ringling's steel undergear and dual rubber tires.









