

This plan is a generic cook house wagon loosely based on the designs of the many Cole Bros. Baggage wagons of the 1930s. The wagons were heavy and sturdy in order to withstand the stress and strain of rough handling in loading and unloading from the circus train The ware and tear on these wagons was multiplied many times over on soft or muddy show grounds. The design of this wagon has a narrow body between the wheels, which allows the carrying of extra equipment on the sides of the wagon. In this case the extra equipment would be seat planks and table tops for the cookhouse tables, and maybe the poles for the cookhouse and dining tops.
