For a little history of these wagons, John G. Robinson dated July 29, 1902 visited the Side Show at Alexandria, Indiana and returned to his winter quarters with the three pony cages and one elephant.

These cages are as follows, the white cage was number 1, the red cage was number 2, the blue cage was number 3. Thus making the red, white and blue.

Each was pulled by one team of ponies. They were about the same design. The lengths, width, height and front and back were the same. The noticeable difference was with the roofs. Two of them had double gables on the side of the roof and the other had a single gable.

The only photos available of these wagons that I know of may be found in Richard Conover's book "Give 'Em A John Robinson." On page 63 you will find good photos of these cages.

















BAR DETAIL = ALL WAGONS SAME

All believed to have been on the Robinson Show as their styling is typical Robinson








WHEEL DETAIL CAGE No 1
