

Let's look at another wagon we seldom hear of and I have picked a little gem of a work horse for your wagon shops to build. This is the small generator wagon once used by The Christy Bros. Circus. This wagon later went out with the Ken Maynard Wild West Show until its fall and ended with the United Tent and Awning Company of Los Angeles, California.

The photo I am using for this article is a Hubler Photo and is also from the Allaire collection.

One interesting feature about this wagon was the size and the location of the brakes. Please note they are at the rear of the rear wheels. This wagon was only ten feet and another feature about this is because of its size, you could use it for your train light plant.

The color scheme of the wagon as far as I can make out from the photo could be orange body with white undergear or red body with the white undergear. The Christy monogram is located on the rear panel.




