

The idea and rough sketches for this were sent in by John Briden. Redrawn by Supt. of Construction John W. Lower.

A Cart similar to this was used recently on Hamid Morton Circus. Make frame work of lite brass wire or welding rod is good or 1/16" tubing would be ok. Shape the pieces and solder together, wrap previous solder joints with wet cloth and they won't remelt. Axle can be soldered on too and wheels from kit can be used. Would try to get open wheels (not sunburst) and narrow tread as a buggy wheel. There is a picture of this Cart on Page 113 of C.P. Fox's book "Performing Horses."



I would suggest painting white and then mixing pink paint in spackle arid form the roses on the Cart, Wheels, Lady's Dress & Hat. Shape dress to fit seat and floor, Color Suggestions: - Horse, Carte Wheels, Lady Driver all White Roses Pink or Red - Plumes same as roses - Harness could be Green with a touch of green here and there on cart to lend to the roses a bit of a foliage theme,

The floor and seat could be wood or cardboard and cemented to frame and these could be painted green or left white, A bit of adjustment of frame in back may be necessary to fit lady used or carving you may make; same may apply to horse depending on height.
