


Longhorn Steer Wagon in parade at Monroe, Wisconsin, during the 1912 season. [Photo from Fred Pfening Collection]

Here are two versions of this wagon. The plan is drawn for the 1912 issue and also for the 1915 issue. Whatever you pick, it is the same wagon therefore the measurements remain the same. One version has painted scenes and scrolls. The other version shows where the wagon was given a skyboard with carvings and the two end panels have carved scrolls.

I do not have any photos of this wagon in my collection but your LCW Editor has secured some from the Editor of the Bandwagon, Fred Pfening. A fine article on the 101 Ranch Circus can be found in the 1969 issue of The Bandwagon (Jan. and Feb.) I would not surprise me at all that the skyboard with carvings may have been taken from The Barnum and Bailey Organmelch or wagon and is now in Baraboo. It sure looks the same.




